History

Liston College was established by Bishop Delargy, in February 1974, originally at the Holy Cross School in Henderson. The College was named after the former Archbishop of Auckland, Bishop James Michael Liston and was originally staffed by the Christian Brothers, a religious order founded in Ireland in the early 1800s by Edmund Rice. In 1975, the Principal, Brother Gary Wellsmore, staff and students moved to the present Rathgar Road site.

Liston College was founded on the Charism of Edmund Rice which challenges staff and students to: *"Act justly, to love tenderly and to walk humbly with your God"*

Pastoral Care

Liston College's Pastoral care system is underpinned by the values of the school.
